

Fun Colour Activities

Learning Colours through Play!

Colour Hunt - You can use coloured bags or baskets or simply set up coloured paper for your child to collect coloured objects that match.

Coloured Bath Time - Set up a set of coloured foam letters that your child could stick to the sides of the tub with water or shaving cream to work on colours, letters and numbers!

Colour Jars - Take a few large jars or containers and fill them with exciting trinkets or toys all of one colour. Make a whole set in all the colours of the rainbow and let your child explore!

Colour Hop - Make a colour 'hopscotch' using sidewalk chalk! Then call out colours - or maybe make a big die or get the twister spinner out- and let your child jump from colour to colour!

Colour Matching - Colour matching is similar to colour sorting but with a bit of a different spin. Instead of just sorting the colours in to piles, your child will have to be able to place a coloured object with it's corresponding coloured partner.

Colour Collages - Make a colour collage to help your child focus on colours. Collect feathers, stickers, paper scraps, magazine images, etc and glue them down on a matching piece of colored paper.
