Stop, Slow, Go Movement Game

Create this fun movement game with construction paper and popsicle sticks. Play as a Red Light, Green Light Game encouraging your child to run, jump, skip or hop. Put on music for your child to get moving and shake their sillies out as they play.

WHAT'S THAT SOUND?

Create a senses game by filling plastic eggs with various items from your home. Small toys, pasta, rice, stones from the garden - all make various sounds. Secure the egg with tape or glue so the objects do not fall out and have your child shake their eggs to the music or play - What's That Sound? - a fun guessing game.



HOMEMADE INSTRUMENTS

Have your child work on their fine motor skills by making instruments with recycables, beans, pasta or rice.
These can be used in directional songs.

KITCHEN Xylophone

Create this interesting musical instrument with water, food colouring and jars/glasses. Varying the levels of water will provide different tones for your child to explore. A small spoon can be used to tap on the jar to create a symphony. Play music for your child to strike up a band.



SONG CUBE

Create a song cube from a small recyclable box and construction paper. Label the box with various action songs for your child to roll and act out.
